Active Shoot: Jim Sly spoke to the Club about the Active Shoot that he is planning for. It will be held at the South Range on May 6 starting at 9am. The minimum age is 8. Cost is \$10 a person. Money will go to the Club. It is an all-day affair. Bring eye and ear protection, and your own drinks and snacks. You will need approximately 100 rounds of ammunition. It is geared for semi-automatics, but if you have revolvers, it is accepted. A single stack 45 is the minimum mag. Brad Smith will be there. He is a Range Safety Officer.

Real life scenarios will be used. It is an IDPA or USPA type of shoot, with the 170 rule being used. Safety is everything. One to two hours of coaching will be given before any shooting starts. A Range Safety Officer stays with one person for every movement from beginning to end during your timed shooting. As Jim described the whole process, it sounds like it will be great training for ALL ages and a lot of fun.
